SAVE also plans to join <u>350.org</u> in its 2011 "Moving Planet" event scheduled for September 24, 2011. As you may know, <u>350.org</u> is an international campaign dedicated to building a movement to unite the world around solutions to the climate crisis – the goal being to reverse the escalating amount of carbon in our atmosphere and get closer to a safer 350 parts per million. SAVE has proudly participated in <u>350.org</u> events over the past two years and this year's event will focus on a day of moving beyond fossil fuels. SAVE plans to kick off its project at Founders Day by asking individuals and/or families to make a pledge to do one or more actions during the upcoming year to help reduce our carbon footprint. We hope you'll stop by the SAVE table at Founders Day to learn more about this project and to participate in this very meaningful day of action.

PLAN TO VISIT THE SAVE TABLE ON FOUNDERS DAY Saturday, September 10, 2011

Don't miss stopping by the SAVE table during Founders Day this year! We will be holding a raffle for a compost bin, with all proceeds going to SAVE's Environmental Fund. In our continuing efforts to reduce our carbon footprint, we will collect worn-out athletic shoes that we will then deliver to Nike's Reuse-a-Shoe program for recycling into materials used in sport and playground surfaces. We'll also have a "mercury drop-off" station for button cell batteries, hearing aid and watch batteries, thermometers and thermostats, etc.

We will also introduce you to SAVE's plan to participate in this year's <u>350.org</u> event called "Moving Planet." On September 24, 2011, <u>350.org</u> will hold a worldwide rally to demand solutions to the climate crisis. SAVE plans to create a pledge board containing individual pledges for actions throughout the upcoming year to lessen our carbon footprint. We'll have a number of suggestions for actions that individuals and/or families can make a pledge to do, or folks can create their own customized pledge. Those making a pledge can then post their pledge on the pledge board. Plan to stop by and find out what it's all about!

HELP REDUCE OUR CARBON FOOTPRINT BY RECYCLING WORN-OUT ATHLETIC SHOES

Here's one way that we can all make a difference and help reduce our carbon footprint! Bring your worn-out athletic shoes (any brand will be accepted) to the SAVE table on Founders Day or to the SWAP at Breakheart's Fall Festival and drop them into the recycling containers. SAVE will then bring all the athletic shoes to a designated Nike Recycling Center drop-off location for participation in the <u>Reuse-A-Shoe</u> program. (Nike partners with members of the National Recycling Coalition, with Reuse-A-Shoe programs and locations around the world.) Following drop-off, the shoes are shipped to a processing facility to be ground up into a material called *Nike Grind*. Then, working with partner organizations, *Nike Grind* is used to make different parts of sport surfaces in communities around the world. Some examples include all-weather track, basketball and cushioned tennis surfaces, soccer fields, fitness flooring, as well as impact-absorbing playground safety surfacing.

Bring as many athletic shoes as you wish – there's no limit – and every pair makes a difference. However, there are a few guidelines for recycling:

- Athletic shoes only (any brand)
- No shoes containing metal
- No cleats or dress shoes
- No wet or damp shoes

This is one positive way that you can help our environment by joining in this recycling effort.



SAVE'S NEXT "IT'S NEW TO YOU" SWAP Breakheart Reservation Saturday, October 1 10:00 am to 12:00 pm

SAVE, DCR and the FRIENDS OF BREAKHEART have joined together to present another "SWAP" event – <u>It's New To You</u> – to keep still-usable items out of the waste stream.

The event, to be held at Breakheart's Christopher P. Dunne Visitors Center in conjunction with Breakheart's Fall Festival, is scheduled for **Saturday, October 1, 2011 from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm** and is open to one and all.

Everyone is invited to bring one or more no longer wanted but still-usable items to swap or just browse the table to pick up something you can use – all FREE – to keep still-usable items out of the waste stream. We ask that items be dropped off early to offer the largest selection of items to the greatest number of people. (Please do not bring any items/products to the SWAP that require special disposal.) Remember, it is not mandatory to take an item if you bring something to donate to the SWAP, nor is it mandatory to bring an item in order to take an item.
